## **To exhibit in the Exhibition Hall**

### **Prior to judging day:**

1. Decide on what you are planning to exhibit. Fill in the entry form inside the schedule. Ensure you have the correct section, class, and class name.
2. Lodge your entry form and entry fees with the society's secretary, on or before the closing date of Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2019. Postage stamps will not be accepted as payment of entry fees.
3. Your entry tickets will be mailed to you. Please attach the white ticket to your exhibit. The red ticket is to be retained by you. You must present your red ticket as proof of ownership for collection of your exhibit the following day (show day). If you do not receive your tickets by judging day, they will be issued to you when you deliver your exhibit to the exhibition hall on judging day.
4. Read the *Rules and Regulations* (inside the schedule).
5. Read the *Guidelines for Exhibitors* to know the judges' criteria and give yourself the best chance of winning.
6. Prepare your exhibits for display on judging day, Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November 2019, the day before show day.

### **On judging day:**

1. The Exhibition Hall opens from 8.30am–1pm on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November 2019 to receive exhibits. Exhibits can be received prior by arrangement.
2. Exhibits for all sections must be delivered and registered by 1pm.
3. On-the-day entries, accompanied by an entry form and entry fees, are accepted at \$1.20 per entry except for Section J which is still \$1.00.
4. Judging in all sections commences at 1.15pm on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November.
5. Prize money is as specified for each section and class in the schedule. No second prize will be paid unless three or more entries are received in that class unless the individual class is sponsored for second prize (Rule 23).
6. Sashes will be awarded for the best exhibit in each section.
7. If there are two or more exhibitors on the same points for the award for the most successful exhibitor, the winner will be the exhibitor who has won the most 1<sup>st</sup> prizes.

### On show day:

1. Prize money for all sections will be paid at the secretary's office after the Grand Parade has concluded at approximately 3:15pm on show day. Money not collected will be forfeited to the society.
2. Exhibits can be collected from the Exhibition Hall after 4pm. Ensure you have the red section tickets with you as proof of ownership of your exhibit.

### Guidelines for exhibitors

These guidelines are based on '*Winning Ways*', the CWA's book that standardises judging at agricultural shows. There are hints for exhibitors, what the judges look for and how they allocate points. A copy can be borrowed from the Exhibition Hall supervisors.

Section F. Vegetables and Fruit. All produce must be grown by the exhibitor. Rhubarb leaves and beetroot tops should be trimmed to about 5cm. Onions should be tied together, tops trimmed to about 5cm, and the outer skin intact.

Section G. Preserves. The bottles of jams, jellies, pickles and sauces should be clean and well polished. Cellophane covers on jam, jelly, marmalade, pickles and relish. Tomato and other sauce bottles should have removable tops. Marmalade – fruit to be sliced. Egg judging, one egg may be broken into a saucer for judging.

FERMENTED SECTION – Items to be labelled; both bottles and jars should be **clear glass** and have removable tops.

Section J. Floral Art and Cut Flowers. Flowers and items for floral art can be from any source. Cut flowers must be grown by the exhibitor.

Section K. Homemade Products. Exhibits must be made by the exhibitor and all cookery must be 24 hours old. All cookery exhibits must be presented on plain white paper/plastic plates (the society does not provide plates). Paper lining should be removed. Biscuits should be uniform in size. Scones should be about 5cm in diameter and do not dust scones with flour. Plum puddings should be removed from cloth and basin. Icing on all cakes should be smooth. No decoration unless stated in schedule. **Ensure no cooling rack marks are showing on product.**

NOVICE SECTION- exhibitor who has not won a first prize at the C.H. Show Classes 1-31 and with no more than 2 years participation in Novice Section.

Section L. Needlework and Sewing, Woolwork and Handicraft. Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor. No exhibit that has won a 1<sup>st</sup> prize at the Circular Head Show to be shown. Articles to be pressed with a damp cloth but washed articles will be disqualified.

Knitting. Tension should be firm but elastic. Patterns should match at the seams. Hand knitted articles must have hand knitted bands. No machine knitted bands permitted. Flat seams should be used for baby wear, and for joining cuffs and bands. All parts of the garment to be in correct proportions. For any non-stated sized garments, attach a note stating reason for irregularity.

Crochet. Firm even tension so that design holds its shape. Use suitable thread ply for design and purpose. Firm strong, inconspicuous joins. Use flat seams for joining.

Section N. Photography. The exhibitor is limited to 3 photographs in each class. All exhibits must have exhibitor's name, address and schedule class number clearly displayed on the back of the mounting card. All classes are open to either colour or black and white prints, unless otherwise stated. Prints not to exceed A4 size, excluding mounting board. **All photographs must be securely stuck to a firm mounting board or card to assist in displaying. No frames are permitted.**

Additional information:

- Entry fees: \$1.00 per exhibit, with the exception of Section L, School Entries. On the day entries are \$1.20 per entry except for Section J which are \$1.00 per entry.
- The committee reserves the right to reclassify articles entered in the wrong class.
- Section K, Class 24 Honey and ginger cake recipe  
185g butter, melted; (150g)  $\frac{3}{4}$  cup firmly packed brown sugar;  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup honey (not leatherwood); 2 eggs; (225g)  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups S.R. flour; (75g)  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup plain flour;  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup milk; 100g crystallised ginger, finely cut.  
Combine all ingredients in a medium bowl of electric mixer, beat on low speed until ingredients are combined. Then beat on medium speed until mixture is smooth and changed in colour. Spread mixture into prepared 20cm tin. Bake in a moderate oven for approx. 45 minutes. Stand for 5 minutes before removing to cool. Do not ice.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Prizes will be awarded to bona fide owners or lessees only.
2. Admission - Members tickets (\$30) allow admission for 3 adults, or 2 adults and 2 children, or 1 adult and 4 children to the Ground. No-one, whether in charge of exhibits or otherwise, will be admitted without a ticket.
3. **The entrance to the show ground located at Marine Esplanade will be manned from 1pm Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November. All exhibitors and competitors arriving on Friday must present a ticket or pay admission charges. Gate keepers must be allowed to attach a wristband which will allow re-entry and/or coverage for show day, Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> November.**
4. All entries must be in writing accompanied by entry fees and lodged with the Secretary on or before the advertised closing date.
5. All stallholders will abide by the stallholders terms and conditions.
6. All exhibitors compete at their own risk.
7. All stock exhibits must be on the Showground and penned where applicable **not later than 8:00 am** on the morning of the Show unless otherwise stated; Exhibition Hall not later than 1:00 pm on the Friday preceding the Saturday of Show day.
8. **Prize money will not be paid until after the conclusion of the grand parade (commences at approximately 3pm). Horse and cattle prize winners must participate in the grand parade to be eligible for their prize. Exhibitor 10 years and under parading in grand parade must be accompanied by an adult. No livestock exhibit to be removed before the conclusion of the grand parade; Exhibition Hall, 4 pm.**
9. Any prizemoney not collected on show day will be forfeited to the society.
10. The Committee will afford every possible facility to exhibitors, and every care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
11. The Society reserves itself the right of refusal of any entry and of substituting a special prize, providing such special prize or trophy shall be of equal value to the prize offered; also to delete or postpone or combine any section or class or part of it.
12. Any dispute as to the interpretation of the rules, bylaws or provisions shall be determined by the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
13. The Society shall not in any circumstances be responsible for any loss or mis-delivery of stock or exhibits.
14. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibit.
15. Should any dispute arise for which no specific rule is laid down, it may be referred to the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
16. Any exhibitor or other person making any annoying remark to any judge, steward or another competitor during the time of judging or competing will be ordered by the stewards to leave the vicinity, and failing to do so, may be removed from the grounds or building, and any exhibit he or she is interested in may be disqualified.

17. No persons, except stewards and those in charge of exhibits will be permitted to remain in any section of Showground or building during judging of said section under any pretext whatsoever. Persons in charge must on no account leave their exhibits unless authorised by the stewards.
18. Exhibitors affixing their names or any distinguishing mark on their exhibits shall be disqualified. This does not refer to ordinary brands on stock.
19. The same exhibit cannot compete in two distinct classes except in Section A or where otherwise specified. Exhibits entered in any class may compete for special prizes, unless otherwise provided conditionally upon entry fees for such special prizes being paid.
20. The judges have the power to withhold or reduce any prize if in their opinion the exhibit is not of the required standard, or does not conform to the requirements of the classes as described in the schedule.
21. No protest will be entertained unless it is in writing and lodged with the Secretary within one hour of the judgement in dispute and accompanied by a \$25 fee which will be forfeited should the complaint be thought to be frivolous by the Executive Committee.
22. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Executive Committee, with or without the advice of the judges, shall decide the question. Section A (Light Horses) refer to notes in Horse Schedule.
23. **No second prize will be paid unless three (3) or more entries are received in that class, regardless of whether the section is sponsored, unless the individual class and prize is sponsored.**
24. Exhibits may only be removed at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
25. JOHNE'S DISEASE: The Society and its insurers accept NO LIABILITY whatsoever for any cattle or sheep which might be a source of infection or contagion to other cattle or sheep exhibited at the C.H. Show at any time.
26. Horses and riders to comply with EFA rules.
27. The ages of horses shall be dated from 1st August and cattle from 1<sup>st</sup> July in each year or as stated.
28. Competing stock will be classed and distinguished by numbers to be affixed to each lot immediately after they are placed in the Show yard
29. If, in the opinion of the Executive Committee, any exhibit or exhibits of stock be deemed to be dangerous, or a source of infection or contagion to any livestock or persons, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's ground or building.
30. In the case of dispute in regard to the height of a horse or pony, the steward in charge shall refer it to the Honorary Veterinary Surgeon, whose decision shall be final.
31. All competitors/exhibitors under 18 years of age in livestock, equestrian, jumping sections must be countersigned by a parent or guardian.
32. The Society reserves the right to test all livestock (cattle and horses) for performance enhancing or modifying agents.
33. Photos taken may be used for publicity purposes and on social media.
