Competition Details

The competition is run in the Beef Australia format, with entries received in **pens of three** cattle in two classes. Many exhibitors who have entered Beef Australia will be familiar with the group entry format, which better reflects the quality of their herd and their ability to select consistently to the required specifications.

The **Proway** handling facility at the Showground has improved safety for volunteers, and allows entries to remain in their groups in single pens for both display and judging, removing the need to mix and draft out individual cattle.

Bonus carcase points may be awarded for the consistency of weight, fat distribution, lean meat yield and eating quality score of the three cattle in each entry.

Competition entries will be judged under MSA criteria, which measures saleable meat yield, market specifications, and importantly, eating quality. Care will be taken to ensure MSA compliance.

The hoof section will be run at the Circular Head Show on **Saturday 30th November 2019**, after which the entries will be transported to Greenham Tasmania.

As occurred last year, entries will then be grazed and fed ad lib silage for 30 days to comply with MSA rules, and processed on Monday 6th January 2020. The carcass assessment will be held the following morning and the presentation of prizes and BBQ will be held at 3pm on Tuesday 7th January 2020.

Greenham Tasmania will feed the cattle free of charge, to ensure these quality carcasses grade for MSA. The cattle will walk from their nearby paddocks directly to the Greenham plant for processing and judging.

All entries are required by law to have National Livestock Identification Scheme (NLIS) tags, and be accompanied by a National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form and MSA Declaration form and a completed Greenham Tasmania ‘Never Ever’ declaration form, if applicable.

Ear tags for identification will be supplied and will be mailed to entrants during the week prior to the Show Day, accompanied by the price schedule.

Cattle with horns exceeding 5cm will not be accepted.

A limit of one pen per class per exhibitor may be enforced at the discretion of the stewards.

Please Note: Unloading facilities - The unloading ramp is located at the rear of the Trade Cattle yards accessible from the old railway line lane. Turn left at the entry to the showground and follow signs. Cattle will be received in trucks **between 6.00 – 8.00am** on Show day or earlier by arrangement with the Stewards. Late arrivals will not be accepted.

Judging commences at 10.00 am Saturday 30th November 2019 at the rear of the Beef Cattle Pavilion. *All are welcome.*

1. Yearling Steer or Heifer Group of Three – Local Trade (GrassFed*)

This class requires Steers or Heifers suitable for the domestic market that have a maximum of 2 permanent incisor teeth and have a carcass weight in the range of 220 to 359.9 kg with a fat cover of 5 – 22 mm (8 – 12 mm ideal). Approximate live weight range from 420 to 690 kg, using a 52% dressing percentage.

2. Prime Beef Steer Group of Three - Japanese Export (Grass Fed*)

This class requires steers suitable for the Japanese Chilled Beef Market with a maximum of 4 teeth and hot standard carcass weight in the range 280 to 439.9 kg with a fat depth at the P8 site of 5 – 22 mm (10 – 15 mm ideal). Approximate live weight range from 520 to 810 kg, using a 54% dressing percentage aiming to achieve a minimum marble score of 2.
