Competition Details

The competition is run in the Beef Australia format, with entries received in **pens of three** cattle in two classes.

The hoof section will be run at the Circular Head Show on **Saturday 30th of November 2024**, after which entries will be transported to Greenham Tasmania, to be grazed and fed ad lib silage for 30 days to comply with MSA rules, and processed in early January 2025.

Competition entries will be judged under MSA criteria, which measures saleable meat yield, market specifications, and importantly, eating quality. Care will be taken to ensure MSA and Never Ever compliance.

Bonus carcase points may be awarded for the consistency of weight, fat distribution, lean meat yield and eating quality score of the three cattle in each entry.

All entries are required by law to have National Livestock Identification Scheme (NLIS) tags, and be accompanied by a National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form, a MSA Declaration form and a completed Greenham Tasmania 'Never Ever' declaration form, if applicable.

Ear tags for identification will be supplied and will be mailed to entrants during the week prior to the Show Day. Cattle with horns exceeding 5 cm will not be accepted.

A limit of one pen per class per exhibitor may be enforced at the discretion of the stewards.

Please Note: Unloading facilities - The unloading ramp is located at the rear of the Trade Cattle yards accessible from the old railway line lane. Turn left at the entry to the showground and follow signs. Cattle will be received in trucks **between 6.00 - 8.00 am** on Show Day or earlier by arrangement with the Stewards. Late arrivals will not be accepted.

Judging commences at 10.00 am Saturday 30thof November 2024 at the rear of the Beef Cattle Shed. All are welcome. Entry forms and information www.circularheadshow.com.au

NOTES:

- Grass fed is when cattle are reared on pasture, fodder crops, hay and silage as per normally accepted farming practices. Eligible feeds are available at https://www.greenham.com.au/wp-content/uploads/2024/02/240205-FACT-SHEET_NE-Eligible-Feeds-List-LR.pdf
- Cattle exhibited cannot have been shown at any other competition.
- Circular Head Agricultural Show 2024 is a Shorthorn feature show.

1. Pen of three Heavy Trade chiller steers or heifers (Grass Fed*)

This class requires Steers or Heifers suitable for the domestic market that have a maximum of 2 permanent incisor teeth and have a carcase weight in the range of 280 to 360 kg with a fat cover of 5-22 mm (8-14 mm ideal). Approximate live weight range from 540 to 690 kg, using a 52% dressing percentage.

2. Pen of three Export chiller bullocks (Grass Fed*)

This class requires steers suitable for the Japanese Chilled Beef Market with a maximum of 4 teeth and hot standard carcase weight in the range 300 to 439.9 kg with a fat depth at the P8 site of 5-22 mm (10-16 mm ideal). Approximate live weight range from 555 to 815 kg, using a 54% dressing percentage aiming to achieve a minimum marble score of 2.

A new innovation for this year, *Ridley Stockfeeds* have generously sponsored grass-based pellets which will supplement the diet of entries through December to maximize grading potential.

Carcase presentations and an information seminar and BBQ sponsored by Greenham Tasmania, to be held on **Friday 10th January, 2025** at the CH Community and Recreation Centre, Nelson Street, Smithton. Event starts at 4pm.

A detailed video presentation of the carcases will be shown, along with judges' comments. There will be no access to the chiller at the Smithton plant as has occurred previously.



RULES AND REGULATIONS

Circular Head Agricultural Show

- 1. Prizes will be awarded to bona fide owners or lessees only.
- 2. Admission Members tickets (\$40) allow admission for 3 adults, or 2 adults and 2 children, or 1 adult and 4 children to the Ground; must be applied for prior to the Show. No-one, whether in charge of exhibits or otherwise, will be admitted without a ticket.
- 3. The entrance to the show ground located at Marine Esplanade will be manned from 1pm Friday prior to the Show. All exhibitors and competitors arriving on Friday must present a ticket or pay admission charges. Gate keepers must be allowed to attach a wristband which will allow re-entry and/or coverage for show day, the next day.
- 4. All entries must be in writing accompanied by entry fees and lodged with the Secretary on or before the advertised closing date.
- 5. All stallholders will abide by the stallholders terms and conditions.
- 6. All exhibitors compete at their own risk.
- 7. **All stock exhibits** must be on the Showground and penned where applicable **not later than 8:00 am** on the morning of the Show unless otherwise stated; Exhibition Hall not later than 1:00 pm on the Friday preceding the Saturday of Show day.
- 8. Prize money will not be paid <u>until after</u> the conclusion of the grand parade (commences at approximately 3pm). Horse and cattle prize winners must participate in the grand parade to be eligible for their prize. Exhibitor 10 years and under parading in grand parade must be accompanied by an adult. No livestock exhibit to be removed before the conclusion of the grand parade, Exhibition Hall, 4 pm.
- 9. Any prize not collected on show day will be forfeited to the society.
- 10. The Committee will afford every possible facility to exhibitors, and every care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
- 11. The Society reserves itself the right of refusal of any entry and of substituting a special prize, providing such special prize or trophy shall be of equal value to the prize offered; also to alter, delete or postpone or combine any section or class or part of it.
- 12. Any dispute as to the interpretation of the rules, bylaws or provisions shall be determined by the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 13. The Society shall not in any circumstances be responsible for any loss or mis-delivery of stock or exhibits.
- 14. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibit.
- 15. Should any dispute arise for which no specific rule is laid down, it may be referred to the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 16. Any exhibitor or other person making any annoying remark to any judge, steward or another competitor during the time of judging or competing will be ordered by the stewards to leave the vicinity, and failing to do so, may be removed from the grounds or building, and any exhibit he or she is interested in may be disqualified.
- 17. No persons, except stewards and those in charge of exhibits will be permitted to remain in any section of Showground or building during judging of said section under any pretext whatsoever. Persons in charge must on no account leave their exhibits unless authorised by the stewards.
- 18. Exhibitors affixing their names or any distinguishing mark on their exhibits shall be disqualified. This does not refer to ordinary brands on stock.
- 19. The same exhibit cannot compete in two distinct classes except where otherwise specified. Exhibits entered in any class may compete for special prizes, unless otherwise provided conditionally upon entry fees for such special prizes being paid.
- 20. The judges have the power to withhold or reduce any prize if in their opinion the exhibit is not of the required standard, or does not conform to the requirements of the classes as described in the schedule.

- 21. No protest will be entertained unless it is in writing and lodged with the Secretary within one hour of the judgement in dispute and accompanied by a \$25 fee which will be forfeited should the complaint be thought to be frivolous by the Executive Committee.
- 22. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Executive Committee, with or without the advice of the judges, shall decide the question.
- 23. No second prize will be paid unless three (3) or more entries are received in that class regardless of whether Section is sponsored, unless the individual class and prize is sponsored.
- 24. Exhibits may only be removed at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
- 25. JOHNE'S DISEASE: The Society and its insurers accept **NO LIABILITY** whatsoever for any cattle or sheep which might be a source of infection or contagion to other cattle or sheep exhibited at the Circular Head Show at any time.
- 26. Horses and riders to comply with EFA rules.
- 27. The ages of horses shall be dated from 1st August and cattle from 1st July in each year or as stated.
- 28. Competing stock will be classed and distinguished by numbers to be affixed to each lot immediately after they are placed in the Show yard
- 29. If, in the opinion of the Executive Committee, any exhibit or exhibits of stock be deemed to be dangerous, or a source of infection or contagion to any livestock or persons, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibits from the Society's ground or building.
- 30. In the case of dispute in regard to the height of a horse or pony, the steward in charge shall refer it to the Honorary Veterinary Surgeon, whose decision shall be final.
- 31. All competitors/exhibitors under 18 years of age in livestock, equestrian, jumping sections must be countersigned by a parent or guardian.
- 32. The Society reserves the right to test all livestock (cattle and horses) for performance enhancing or modifying agent.
- 33. Photos taken at the event by a representative of the Society may be used on social media and for publicity.
- 34. No petitions or raffles to be held on the day without the permission of the Society.
- 35. If cancellation of the event occurs at the last minute, every effort will be made to notify exhibitors and/or refund any monies paid.
